Introduction

- Title Of The Message: “The Chief Cornerstone”

- **Illustration**

- **Christian Herter governor of Massachusetts**
 - Christian Herter was the governor of Massachusetts in the 1950s.
 - One day, after a busy morning chasing votes and going without lunch, he arrived at an evening barbecue.
 - Herter was famished.
 - As he moved down the serving line, he held out his plate to the woman serving the chicken.
 - She put a piece on his plate and turned to the next person in line
 - “Excuse me,” Governor Herter said, “do you mind if I have another piece?”
 - “Sorry,” she told him. “I’m only allowed to give one piece to each person.”
 - “But I’m starved,” the governor said.
 - “Sorry. Only one per person.”
 - Governor Herter was usually an unassuming man, but this time he decided to throw a little weight around.

- “Do you know who I am?” he said. “I am the governor of this state.”
- She Answered - “Do you know who I am?”
 - “I’m the lady in charge of the chicken... Move along, mister.”

- **Who has the REAL Authority**

- **The Scribes, Pharisees, Sadducees, and Chief Priests**
 - They Thought they had the Authority
 - The people thought they had the Authority
 - **BUT Jesus is showing them His Authority IS greater!!!**
- **NOW HOW Will THEY Respond**
 - Except it?
 - Surrender to it?
 - Yield to it?
- **As We know - They REJECT It**
 - Why?
 - Not Because of Ignorance about who Jesus was/is
 - BUT because of their opposition to God
 - That resulted in them not SUBMITTING to the Authority of Jesus
 - Bottom LINE IT WAS THEIR PRIDE

- **Review - Chapter 11**

- **The Lord Has Need Of IT - The Triumphal Entry (11:1-12)**
 - The Preparation vs. 1-6
 - The Disciple get the donkey – Just like Jesus said
 - The Praise vs. 7-11
 - They lay their clothes out and wave Plam Branches
 - Shout Hosana – Save Now
 - They are shouting out from the Hallel (Ps. 113-118)
 - The Jewish people should not have missed this day
 - We left Jesus at the Temple = Jesus was making His assessment –
 - He then leaves and makes His way back to Bethany
- **Have Faith In God (11:13-33)**
 - **Faith In God Produces Fruit vs. 12-19**
 - Object Lesson of the Olive Tree not bearing Fruit
 - It was an Example of How Israel was given responsibility to be witnesses for God in the Lost world YET
 - Their religion was more important then there love for the lost
 - Not ONLY that but they turned His Temple into a den of thieves
 - **Faith In God Believes In The Power Of His Word vs. 20-24**
 - Object Lesson On Prayer

- Have Faith IN Jesus
- **Faith In God Produces Forgiveness vs. 25-26**
 - Very Clear here
 - If we Call Ourselves Believers – We MUST FORGIVE others
- **Faith In God Understands His Authority vs. 27-33**
 - Last week
 - We rushed through this a bit so this morning lets look a little closer
 - What this is all about is
 - WHO is in Charge Who has the Authority
 - From this point we will see a series of confrontations to Jesus in regards to who has the authority

• **Now This Morning 2 Main Points**

- The Confrontation vs. 11:27-33
- The Chief Cornerstone vs. 12:1-12

The Confrontation vs. 11:27-33

• **First: Religious Leader Question Jesus' Authority vs. 27-28**

- **1st As He was walking in the temple, the chief priests, the scribes... v. 27**

Mark 11:27 (NKJV)

27 Then they came again to Jerusalem. And as He was walking in the temple, the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders came to Him.

- **Who Are THESE guys?!**

- They are the guys Jesus had upset
 - The day before when He cleaned house in the Temple.
- Known as the Sanhedrin
 - It was made up of...
 - 1st The chief priests were not the high priests
 - But the leaders of the priests chosen to be in the Sanhedrin
 - 2nd The scribes were the lawyers
 - Not like on Law and Order
 - But these were the religious experts in the Law of Moses.
 - 3rd The elders
 - Were the secular leaders of the Jews.
 - Some would be Sadducees and others would be Pharisees.

- **Their Purpose**

- Put Jesus in His place!
- Discredit Jesus
- **2nd They (Religious Leaders) Want to know on whose Authority? v. 28**

Mark 11:28 (NKJV)

28 And they said to Him, “By what authority are You doing these things? And who gave You this authority to do these things?”

▪ **By what Authority are You DOING THESE THINGS?”**

- NOW WHAT THINGS?
 - Go back to Mark 11:15-17

Mark 11:15–17 (NKJV)

15 *So they came to Jerusalem. Then Jesus went into the temple and began to drive out those who bought and sold in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves.*

16 *And He would not allow anyone to carry wares through the temple.*

17 *Then He taught, saying to them, “Is it not written, ‘My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations’? But you have made it a ‘den of thieves.’ ”*

▪ **Jesus said, “...My house...”**

- They Thought they were in Charge
 - The leaders thought it was God’s house
 - That they were managing for Him...
 - If anyone could say “It’s my house” it WOULD BE the religious leaders
- But Jesus says, “...My house...”

▪ **NOW Remember**

- They’re the ones that set up that commercialization in the temple
- They are the ones who instead of PRAYING for the PEOPLE the PREYED on the PEOPLE
- Jesus is kicking them out and saying,

- “This is My house and you’ve made it a den of thieves.”
- So they’re wanting to know,
 - “By what authority do you do these things.”
- **Their REAL Motives**
 - NOW They KNEW BUT did NOT want to Except Jesus
 - They are trying to push our Lord into a dilemma
 - So that no matter how He answered, He would be in trouble
 - If He said that He had NO AUTHORITY
 - Then He was in trouble with the Jews for invading their temple and acting like a prophet
 - If He said that - His authority as the MESSIAH...
 - Then He would be in trouble with the Romans who were always alert to would-be messiahs, especially during Passover season

• **Second: Jesus Answers With a Question vs. 29-33**

- **1st Now Jesus wasn’t AVOID THE QUESTION of Authority v. 29**

Mark 11:29–30 (NKJV)

29 But Jesus answered and said to them, *“I also will ask you one question; then answer Me, and I will tell you by what authority I do these things:*

- **The inference here is –**
 - I will tell you, BUT ONLY after you Tell me...

- He had already said on MANY occasions that He CAME FROM GOD
- Jesus is attempting to get them to answer their OWN Question
- **He ALSO knew what they were doing in trying to trap Him...**
 - So Jesus just turns the tables on them...
 - He's exposing them
 - His response, as usual, is brilliant
- **2nd So Jesus took them back to John the Baptist v. 30**

Mark 11:30 (NKJV)

30 *The baptism of John—was it from heaven or from men? Answer Me."*

- **JTB had come on the scene as the fore runner**
 - To prepare the way for the Messiah
- **Jesus was asking them whether or not JTB ministry was from God**
 - Ironically - It was They're responsible to know
 - As the "Leaders" of Israel they needed to know in order to protect the people
- **So Jesus raised the question of their competence to judge such an issue**
 - Were those who went out to be baptized at the Jordan responding to a merely human impulse or were they in fact answering a divine challenge?
- **So Answer – Answer Your OWN Question**

- If John really was from God
 - Then he was right about Jesus
 - And Jesus was indeed the Messiah.
- If what John said was true
 - Then Jesus had all authority.
- **3rd We do not know vs. 31-32**

Mark 11:31–32 (NKJV)

31 *And they reasoned among themselves, saying, “If we say, ‘From heaven,’ He will say, ‘Why then did you not believe him?’*
32 *But if we say, ‘From men’ ”—they feared the people, for all counted John to have been a prophet indeed.*

▪ **Their Response to His question**

- Exposed the fact that these men were NOT Sincere Seekers of truth.
- They cared more about scoring points in debate and in pleasing the crowds than in knowing the truth

▪ **Application - Unbeliever will have to give an account before God**

- **There are MANY unbelievers THAT have the SAME Heart as the “Leaders” of Israel**
 - If ANY unbeliever was really willing to look at the facts on...
 - Creation
 - WHO Jesus is
 - What He did

- They too are LEFT with ONLY one Choice
 - Romans 1:18-23
 - THEY HAVE No Excuse
- BUT Sadly many aren't willing to deal with the facts
 - They don't want to listen
 - "I don't know whether is true or not true...I don't want to deal with it"
 - Unbelief / PRIDE
 - Causes a person to put up a smoke screen and not listen to and examine the facts
- **The RESULT**
 - When a man rejects the Truth he will believe anything!

2 Thessalonians 2:9–12 (NKJV)

9 The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders,
10 and with all unrighteous deception among those who perish, because they did not receive the love of the truth, that they might be saved.
11 And for this reason God will send them strong delusion, that they should believe the lie,
12 that they all may be condemned who did not believe the truth but had pleasure in unrighteousness.

- Resist LONG Enough... Romans 1:24-32

Romans 1:24–32 (NKJV)

24 Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves,
25 who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.
26 For this reason God gave them up to vile passions. For even their women exchanged the natural use for what is against nature.

27 Likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust for one another, men with men committing what is shameful, and receiving in themselves the penalty of their error which was due.

28 And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a debased mind, to do those things which are not fitting;

29 being filled with all unrighteousness, sexual immorality, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, evil-mindedness; they are whisperers,

30 backbiters, haters of God, violent, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,

31 undiscerning, untrustworthy, unloving, unforgiving, unmerciful;

32 who, knowing the righteous judgment of God, that those who practice such things are deserving of death, not only do the same but also approve of those who practice them.

▪ **Application**

- 1st Have you ever tried to Witness to someone

- BUT they don't care about the Lord and it only resulted in more anger or problems or insults?

- You see these men weren't really interested in the Lord...their hearts were far from Him...and they speak of a lot of people today
- People who's hearts are hardened...they won't be intellectually honest...they play games...like these leaders

- My Advice

- Give the Gospel (TRUTH) in LOVE
- Commit to Praying for them
- You CANT make people come to Jesus
- It is a WORK of The HS

John 6:44 (NKJV)

44 *No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up at the last day.*

- SO Don't PUSH
 - Remember it is just your job to share
 - It is HIS job to save
- Question: How are YOU Receiving the TRUTH?
 - Have you been obedient to what the Lord has already been showing you?
- 4th Jesus Says v. 33

Mark 11:33 (NKJV)

33 *So they answered and said to Jesus, "We do not know." And Jesus answered and said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things."*

- Nor Will I Tell YOU
 - They willingly REFUSED to acknowledge the truth that was plainly revealed to them

The Chief Cornerstone vs. 12:1-12

• **First: Parable About The Wicked Vinedressers vs. 1-8**

- **1st He leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country v. 1**

Mark 12:1 (NKJV)

1 *Then He began to speak to them in parables: "A man planted a vineyard and set a hedge around it, dug a place for the wine vat and built a tower. And he leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country.*

- Now if you're Jewish...you know right away...the VINEYARD is Israel
 - History

- This sort of tenant farming relationship was a common practice in Jesus' day especially in the region of Galilee.
- Archaeologists have discovered records of this same sort of dispute between landowners and tenant farmers
- The Bible
 - BUT Also they would have known the Scriptures (Isaiah 5:1-7).

Isaiah 5:7 (NKJV)

7 For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, And the men of Judah are His pleasant plant. He looked for justice, but behold, oppression; For righteousness, but behold, a cry for help.

- They Know this Parable is about them
- The man who planted a vineyard –
 - God Himself.
- The Vineyard
 - A symbol of Israel
 - The vineyard represented the people of God as a whole
- The Hedge was
 - The Law of Moses
 - Which separated Israel from the Gentiles and preserved them as a distinct people for the Lord.
- The Vinedressers were

- The religious leaders
- The Pharisees, the scribes and the elders.
- **2nd That he might receive some of the fruit of the vineyard v. 2**

Mark 12:2 (NKJV)

2 Now at vintage-time he sent a servant to the vinedressers, that he might receive some of the fruit of the vineyard from the vinedressers.

- **Better translated, “harvesttime.”**
 - This usually occurred for the first time in the fifth year after the initial planting (Lev. 19:23–25).
- **Servant.**
 - All the servants in the parable represent
 - The OT prophets.

- **3rd And they took him and beat him and sent him away empty-handed v. 3-5**

Mark 12:3–5 (NKJV)

- 3 And they took him and beat him and sent him away empty-handed.*
- 4 Again he sent them another servant, and at him they threw stones, wounded him in the head, and sent him away shamefully treated.*
- 5 And again he sent another, and him they killed; and many others, beating some and killing some.*

- **The vinedressers didn’t BUY nor BUILD the Vineyard**
 - A generous owner allowed them to work in his vineyard
 - They began to think they OWN it
 - They turned against the owner!!!
 - **Application**

- Quick Admonition
- We DON'T OWN the CHURCH we are just stewards
- We have no right to tinker with His Church or HIS WORD

▪ **They Persecuted the servant sent**

- Prophets
 - They were sent away empty-handed...
 - They were beat...
 - Treated shamefully...
 - They were wounded...
 - They were cast out
- NT References

Matthew 23:34–38 (NKJV)

- 34** *Therefore, indeed, I send you prophets, wise men, and scribes: some of them you will kill and crucify, and some of them you will scourge in your synagogues and persecute from city to city,*
- 35** *that on you may come all the righteous blood shed on the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel to the blood of Zechariah, son of Berechiah, whom you murdered between the temple and the altar.*
- 36** *Assuredly, I say to you, all these things will come upon this generation.*
- 37** *“O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing!*
- 38** *See! Your house is left to you desolate;*

Acts 7:51–52 (NKJV)

- 51** *“You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers did, so do you.*

52 Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who foretold the coming of the Just One, of whom you now have become the betrayers and murderers,

Hebrews 11:36–38 (NKJV)

36 Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment.

37 They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented—

38 of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth.

- SO when we are Persecuted

Matthew 5:11–12 (NKJV)

11 “Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake.

12 Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

- REJOICE – UGH 😊
- **4th Therefore Still Having vs. 6-8**

Mark 12:6–8 (NKJV)

6 Therefore still having one son, his beloved, he also sent him to them last, saying, ‘They will respect my son.’

7 But those vinedressers said among themselves, ‘This is the heir. Come, let us kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.’

8 So they took him and killed him and cast him out of the vineyard.

▪ **1st This is the gracious hand of God**

- Notice he says
 - “His Beloved”
 - Luke says Beloved Son
 - Not just, “I’ll send my son.”

- GREAT INSIGHT INTO THE HEART OF GOD
 - NO man would send his son into a situation where his other representatives had been murdered!
 - God extends His love towards THEM / US in the person of Jesus Christ
 - And when a person rejects that, they're rejecting the Son of His love
 - They're rejecting His love

▪ **2nd Jesus is Exposing Them**

- In this parable, Jesus isn't pleading for His own life...He knows He is going to the Cross
- It's been His plan all along
- I believe He's giving them a CHANCE to REPENT

▪ **3rd NOW Who Killed Jesus**

- Its important that every one of us is very clear in our minds about who crucified Jesus
 - YOU DID
 - Your SINS held Him on that CROSS
- BUT Sadly
 - Many over the YEARS feel that all Jewish people crucified Jesus
 - *According to Augustine; "Judaism, since Christ, is a corruption; indeed, Judas is the image of the Jewish people: their understanding of Scripture is carnal; they bear the guilt for the death of the*

Savior, for through their fathers they have killed Christ. The house of Israel which God has cast off... are themselves the builders of destruction and rejecters of the cornerstone, the Lord Christ distinguished between His faithful ones and His Jewish enemies”

- But that is not the teaching of the Bible
- It was US
 - If anyone them the Jewish leadership
 - The common people were throwing down palm branches

• **Second: The Application Jesus Gives To The Parable vs. 9-12**

- **1st Therefore what will the owner of the vineyard do? v. 9a**

Mark 12:9 (NKJV)

9 “Therefore what will the owner of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy the vinedressers, and give the vineyard to others.

- **The vinedressers were foolish enough**
 - To think that if they only killed the owner’s son, the vineyard would be theirs.
- **Jesus drew the correct point –**
 - They rejected messenger after messenger, finally rejecting the Son, so their day of reckoning would come (He will come and destroy the vinedressers).
- **Destruction - 70 AD**
 - This literally happened when the armies of Rome under Titus came in around 66 AD...
 - The city fell in 70 AD

- Destroyed city
- Titus did ordered to leave the TEMPLE standing
 - But a Fire broke out
 - In the fire gold melting
 - Greed to get the Gold / They tore it Down
 - Not One stone was left one another
- We know from the historian Josephus that the things Jesus said here...literally took place

Over 1 million people died

- **2nd “Give it to others” – Gentiles v. 9b**

Mark 12:9 (NKJV)

9 “Therefore what will the owner of the vineyard do? He will come and destroy the vinedressers, and give the vineyard to others.”

John 10:16 (NKJV)

16 And other sheep I have which are not of this fold; them also I must bring, and they will hear My voice; and there will be one flock and one shepherd.

- Jesus predicted that Gentiles would come to believe in Him as savior

- PLEASE NOTE

- Gave Gentile Salvation
- NOT the Covenant Promise that God gave Abraham

- Replacement Theology is lie from the pit of HELL

- **3rd Have you not even read this Scripture vs. 10-11**

Mark 12:10–11 (NKJV)

10 *Have you not even read this Scripture: 'The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone.*

11 *This was the LORD's doing, And it is marvelous in our eyes'?"*

▪ **1st What is the Chief Cornerstone?**

- In these times
 - Builders used cornerstones in their construction projects.
 - A Cornerstone was the Principal Stone
 - Usually placed at the corner of an edifice
 - To guide the workers in their course.
 - The cornerstone was usually one of the largest
 - The most solid, and the most carefully constructed of any in the edifice
 - Once the cornerstone was set,
 - It became the basis for determining every measurement in the remaining construction; everything was aligned to it.
- The Bible describes Jesus as the cornerstone
 - That His church would be built upon.
 - He is foundational.
 - Jesus is our standard of measure and alignment.

▪ **2nd Jesus quotes from Psalm 118**

Psalm 118:22 (NKJV)

22 The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone.

- Why would builders reject a chief cornerstone?
- **1st The builders would reject it if they didn't think it fit right.**
 - Jesus was certainly not the type of Savior they were expecting
 - He did not 'fit' THEIR expectations
 - BUT all they NEEDED to Do was READ the Word of GOD
- **2nd The builders would reject it if it lacked a certain beauty.**
 - Jesus was common, ordinary;
 - He wasn't even "educated"
 - They wanted someone more to their liking.
- **3rd The builders would reject it if they didn't think it could support the structure.**
 - Jesus was about to fulfill and finish all the Old Testament symbolism.
 - Their whole system of doing things was about to be changed.
 - They liked their system!
 - They wanted it to be supported, NOT fulfilled.
- **4th They knew He had spoken the parable against them v. 12**

Mark 12:12 (NKJV)

12 And they sought to lay hands on Him, but feared the multitude, for they knew He had spoken the parable against them. So they left Him and went away.

- They were cut to the heart and convicted by the Holy Spirit.
 - They reacted to the conviction of the Holy Spirit by rejecting, not by receiving.
 - They plotted to murder Jesus instead of repenting before Him.

• **Third: The Application to Cornerstone is**

○ **1st A Rock Of Rejection**

- 1 Peter 2:7-8 / Psalm 118:22 / Romans 9:30-33

1 Peter 2:7–8 (NKJV)

7 Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, “The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone,”

8 and “A stone of stumbling And a rock of offense.” They stumble, being disobedient to the word, to which they also were appointed.

- That’s what we learned in Mark 12
 - It’s a rock people are stumbling over
 - It’s a rock of offense and stumbling and the leaders have tripped over it

○ **2nd A Rock Of Destruction**

- Dan. 2:34-35, 44-45 - Stone that destroys the kingdoms of this world

Daniel 2:34–35 (NKJV)

34 You watched while a stone was cut out without hands, which struck the image on its feet of iron and clay, and broke them in pieces.

35 Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver, and the gold were crushed together, and became like chaff from the summer threshing floors; the wind

carried them away so that no trace of them was found. And the stone that struck the image became a great mountain and filled the whole earth.

Daniel 2:44–45 (NKJV)

44 And in the days of these kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed; and the kingdom shall not be left to other people; it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand forever.

45 Inasmuch as you saw that the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands, and that it broke in pieces the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver, and the gold—the great God has made known to the king what will come to pass after this. The dream is certain, and its interpretation is sure.”

○ **3rd A Rock Of Salvation**

- Peter said in Acts 4:11-12

Acts 4:11–12 (NKJV)

11 This is the ‘stone which was rejected by you builders, which has become the chief cornerstone.’

12 Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

1 Peter 2:6–7 (NKJV)

6 Therefore it is also contained in the Scripture, “Behold, I lay in Zion A chief cornerstone, elect, precious, And he who believes on Him will by no means be put to shame.”

7 Therefore, to you who believe, He is precious; but to those who are disobedient, “The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone,”

Romans 9:33 (NKJV)

33 As it is written: “Behold, I lay in Zion a stumbling stone and rock of offense, And whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame.”

○ **4th A Rock Of Foundation**

Ephesians 2:20 (NKJV)

20 having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone,

- Jesus is the foundation and the Head of the church

1 Corinthians 3:11 (NKJV)

11 For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

- **5th A Rock Of Protection**

- Psalm 18 is know as the rock chapter

Psalm 18:2 (NKJV)

2 The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; My God, my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.

Psalm 18:31 (NKJV)

31 For who is God, except the LORD? And who is a rock, except our God?

Psalm 18:46 (NKJV)

46 The LORD lives! Blessed be my Rock! Let the God of my salvation be exalted.

Psalm 31:1–5 (NKJV)

- 1** In You, O LORD, I put my trust; Let me never be ashamed; Deliver me in Your righteousness.
- 2** Bow down Your ear to me, Deliver me speedily; Be my rock of refuge, A fortress of defense to save me.
- 3** For You are my rock and my fortress; Therefore, for Your name's sake, Lead me and guide me.
- 4** Pull me out of the net which they have secretly laid for me, For You are my strength.
- 5** Into Your hand I commit my spirit; You have redeemed me, O LORD God of truth.

Psalm 61:1–4 (NKJV)

- 1** Hear my cry, O God; Attend to my prayer.
- 2** From the end of the earth I will cry to You, When my heart is overwhelmed; Lead me to the rock that is higher than I.
- 3** For You have been a shelter for me, A strong tower from the enemy.
- 4** I will abide in Your tabernacle forever; I will trust in the shelter of Your wings.
